(FSP events have a limited entry and entries will be taken on a first come first served basis, entry opening dates will appear on the website. Entry (non-refundable) must be paid in full before entry in competition can be confirmed.

The junior entry fee **ONLY** applies to members of National Governing Bodies, who are either under 21 years of age or in full time education and under 25 years of age (student card must be shown).

Notes on Entry Times

*****DTL** 1st November to 31st March entries close at 1pm.

*****Olympic Trap/ABT** Between 1st November and 31st January entries close at 10.00am. For weekday entry shoot times see calendar and check website.

Grounds may take entries earlier at their own discretion provided a jury is in place.

Grounds may take entries up to one hour after entry closing time (2½ hours in ABT), these entries will be classed as Late Entries (LE) This entry is only at the discretion of the club and providing they enter within one hour (2½ hours in ABT) of the published entry closing time they will pay the same entry fee as a “birds only” entry. However they cannot win any badge, trophy or prize money, they will have their score returned to be used for classification and team selection only.

Full details on special entry criteria later in this article. Entry fees and times may vary from the above for events run on weekdays or in conjunction with BICTSF, ICTSF, ICTSC or their affiliated bodies.

(*FW) Denotes a shoot where Fibre Wadded only cartridges can be used, any shooter found to be using an unauthorised cartridge will in the first instance have their score withdrawn by the jury who in turn will inform the board of the incident who will take action as per the disciplinary code of conduct.

Ulster Open and Ulster Novice Championships:-

Where possible these championships should be held at PSNI Authorised Clubs to enable all members including under 16's to take part.

Ulster Open Championship Categories:-

Veterans Will have had their 55th birthday and Super Veterans their 65th Birthday before 1st January 2020, Juniors will not have had their 21st birthday 1st January 2020.

Ulster Open/Grand Prix or other events run as 125 100 + 25 for top 5/6 prizes will be awarded as follows. Following the final 25 the highest scorer ex 125 will be awarded the Ulster Open/Grand Prix and the High Gun prize money. The second highest score ex 125 will be awarded the runner-up badge and the runner-up prize money.

The class awards will then be determined from the first 100 targets for the rest of the competitors. Ulster Open & Grand Prix 100 target events, high gun and runner-
